### **Actions/Activities by the local Neighbourhood Policing Team**

Patrols have been conducted by the Neighbourhood Team with a focus on our priority of drug dealing in the area and further intelligence has been submitted. PC Turner has spoken to a group of males that were parked up in local drug hotspot. One male was found to be in possession of an illegal substance and has received a formal warning.

The team has also been busy engaging with the local school children, we attended Mount Pleasant Primary to assist the children with watching the Police Dog try outs for the upcoming trials in May. The children had a fabulous time and it allowed them to get to know the team and understand our role in the area. We also attended Rogerstone Primary School with a dog unit and a riot van to assist them with their 999 what's your emergency week. We were able to show the children the different roles within the Police service and show that we are there to support them as much as we are to deal with them if they misbehave.

We have received multiple complaints regarding parked vehicles causing an obstruction however officers have attended and no parking offences have been committed.

The team has continued to work extremely hard to identify and engage with vulnerable adults living within the ward. They receive regular visits from the team to check their welfare, wellbeing and to discuss any issues that they may have.
